



## Highland Speed Championship REGULATIONS 2011

### 1.0 General:

#### 1.1 Championship Description:

The Championship is organised and administered by the Highland Speed Championship Club and includes events of Aberdeen & District Car Club, Caithness Car Club, Grampian Automobile Club, Lothian Car Club in accordance with the General Regulations of the Royal Automobile Club Motor Sports Association (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Championship Regulations. Other clubs may be added.

#### 1.3 Competitor Eligibility:

- 1.3.1 All members of the Highland Speed Championship Club are eligible for entry.
- 1.3.2 Entrants must be fully paid up valid members of the Highland Speed Championship Club and in possession of a valid 2011 MSA Entrants Licence.
- 1.3.3 Drivers or Entrant/Drivers must be fully paid up valid members of the Highland Speed Championship Club, be registered with the Championship and be in possession of a valid 2011 MSA Competition Licence (or suitable equivalent in accordance with Sections H26.1.5 & H26.2.1(b) of the 2011 MSA Yearbook) of minimum Non Race National B status. Licences of a higher grade may be applicable to drivers of some Sports Libre cars and Racing cars.

A competitor shall not take time off school to participate in motor sport without the prior written approval of their school. If participation in the Championship(s) requires absence from school, Drivers in full time school education are required to have the approval of their head teacher and a letter stating such approval from his/her school in order to fulfil registration for the Championship(s).

- 1.3.4 All necessary documentation must be presented for checking at all rounds when signing on.

#### 1.4 Registration:

- 1.4.1 All drivers must register as competitors for the Championship by returning a completed registration form with the Registration fee to the Championship Coordinator prior to the final closing date at the above address.
- 1.4.2 The registration fee is £10 (cheques payable to Highland Speed Championship).

1.4.3 Registrations will be accepted from publication of these regulations until 1st July 2011. No points will be awarded retrospectively for events competed prior to receiving confirmation of registration to the Championship.

1.4.4 The committee reserves the right to allow entry to the club at its sole discretion.

- 1.5.3 Should any of the above events be cancelled, the Championship Coordinator may announce alternative arrangements, in accordance with the rules of the current MSA Yearbook (dates may be subject to alteration, but the original number of events may not be increased).
- 1.5.4 It is the responsibility of competitors to submit entry forms for events as soon as possible in accordance with each organising club's supplementary regulations. Clubs should provide the Championship with Regulations and entry forms as soon as they are made available which will then be posted on the Championship website [www.prhighlandspeedchampionship.co.uk](http://www.prhighlandspeedchampionship.co.uk). If a competitor does not have Internet Access please indicate this on the registration form and the Championship Coordinator will arrange to have a paper copy sent to you. **NOTE:** The Championship does **NOT** require clubs to send out a paper copy of regulations/entry forms, instead it is the competitor's responsibility to download the regulations. Queries regarding the individual events should be directed to the organising club, contact details can be found in section 1.5.2 of these regulations.

## 1.6 Scoring:

- 1.6.1 The Championship will consist of fifteen rounds.
- 1.6.2.a Classes with 3 or more Championship-registered competitors at the start of each event:  
Scoring will be 10, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 in each class. An extra point will be awarded for any competitor breaking a previously established class record as advised by the organising club. For example, first in class with new record scores 11 points and second in class but below the existing class record scores 9 points and so on. Non-championship drivers will be ignored. All competitors completing a timed run will be awarded a minimum of 1 point.
- 1.6.2.b Classes with less than 3 Championship-registered competitors at the start of each event:  
Scoring will be 6 for a class win and 5 for second in class. In the event of a competitor breaking a previously established class record as advised by the organising club, a maximum of 11 points will be awarded. Second in class will be awarded 9 points if he/she also breaks the class record, otherwise 5 points will be awarded as above. Non-championship drivers will be ignored. All competitors completing a timed run will be awarded a minimum of 1 point.
- 1.6.2.c The number of scoring rounds will be nine from fifteen. Should circumstances change the number of Championship rounds the following scoring system will be utilised: eight rounds from thirteen or fourteen events, seven rounds from eleven or twelve events, six rounds from nine or ten events and so on.
- 1.6.2.d All competitors must enter and include in their counting scores results from at least two sprints and two hillclimbs.
- 1.6.3 In the event of a tie for any award, the competitor with the greatest number of class wins in the counting scores will be judged the winner. If this does not produce a result, then second in class, third in class etc. scores will be considered until a result is achieved. If no result is achieved with this method then the dropped scores will be included to determine the winner. In the event that no result is still achieved the number of class records broken will be taken into consideration.
- 1.6.4 Championship points appeals must be made within 7 days of each bulletin being available with reference to the current MSA Yearbook. A bulletin is a communication made available equally to all competitors whether by post, e-mail or posted on the Championship Website. Interim or draft results displayed at events are not to be regarded as an official bulletin for this purpose.
- 1.6.5 If a competitor gives up his entry on the day to marshal or officiate in order to allow an event counting towards the HSC to run, 5 points will be awarded for that event. This will apply at a maximum of two events. It is the competitor's responsibility to advise the Championship Coordinator that this has happened.
- 1.6.6 The counting score is the event points used to calculate the competitor's place in the Championship.

## 1.7 Awards:

- 1.7.1 Awards will be presented at the end of the year to the Overall Champion, Road Car Champion, Ladies Champion, Best Newcomer and Class winners. Awards may be given subject to the number of entries. Other awards may be given at the discretion of the Championship organisers.
- 1.7.2 The Overall Champion and Road Car Champion will not be eligible for a Class award.
- 1.7.3 Championship decals must be displayed at all events as specified in the MSA year book regulations for points to be awarded.
- 1.7.4 Trophies are awarded at the end of the year at the HSC awards prize giving. It is the competitor's responsibility to collect any trophies won.

- 1.7.5 No bonuses are applicable.
- 1.7.6 Title to all trophies:  
In the event of any Provisional Results of Championship Tables being revised after any provisional presentations and such revisions affect the distribution of any awards, the Competitors concerned must return such awards to the HSC Coordinator in good condition within 7 days.
- 1.7.7 Overall Champion is for the competitor who scores the highest number of points irrespective of class, subject to 1.6.2 above.
- 1.7.8 There will be a Top 10 award for the competitor who scores the highest score for fastest championship time of the day.. This award will be scored as follows: At each event the fastest 10 HSC competitors overall will receive points (10, 9,8,7,6,5,4,3,2,1). The Top 10 Champion will be the competitor with the highest score from ten events (not necessarily the same ten events used to calculate his class position), subject to 1.6.2.d.
- 1.7.9 Class Award is for the competitor who scores the most points in their class, subject to 1.6.2 above.
- 1.7.9.a The Best Newcomers Award is for competitors who have not previously competed in a sprint, speed or hillclimb championship
- 1.7.9.b The Best Newcomers Award will be presented to the newcomer, covering all divisions, with the highest Championship score.
- 1.7.10 The Ladies award will be presented to the lady whose counting score is the highest percentage of the counting score of the winner of her class. The Ladies award is calculated at the end of the season on Championship scores.

1.8 **Double entries:**

Competitors may register no more than two cars in the Championship and no more than two drivers may drive the same car. No competitor may enter more than one car in the same class. A car may not be entered in more than one class.

1.9 **Vehicle Substitution**

A competitor may substitute another vehicle during the course of the Championship, but the substitute vehicle must be in the same class as the original entry. A competitor must notify the Championship Coordinator in writing of any substitution prior to the commencement of practice for the event in which the substitute vehicle is to be used, before scores so gained can be credited to that competitor. A letter notifying the change and for forwarding to the Championship Coordinator will be considered adequate notification when lodged with the Secretary of the Meeting prior to commencement of practice. There will be no limit to the number of substitutions that can be made.

1.10 **Communication**

The preferred method of communication for championship results and other relevant information to competitors shall be email. Any competitor wishing to receive a paper copy of communications should indicate so on the championship registration form.

**2.0 Sporting Regulations - Judicial Procedures:**

**2.1 Events**

Events will be regulated in accordance with Section C of the 2011 MSA Year Book and these regulations.

**2.2 Championship**

The Championship will be regulated in accordance with Section C of the 2011 MSA Year Book and these regulations. Penalties may be applied by the Championship Stewards as appropriate to the offence, including exclusion from the championship.

### **3.0 Technical Regulations:**

#### **3.1 Technical regulations, all cars:**

3.1.1 In addition to complying with the appropriate category regulations (Section S10-S15 refers), cars in all classes must comply with the requirements of Regulation S10.10, which states:

“Other than the provisions of J, S10, and the specific category regulations as appropriate, modifications are free.”

3.1.2 The questions on the Championship Registration Form with regard to capacity etc. must be accurately answered and, in classes A1 to A8 inclusive, a list of modifications must be made. Any non-declared modifications or any false statement discovered at scrutineering, during eligibility inspection or subsequently may result in loss of all Championship points or exclusion (See Section 2.2 of these regulations).

#### **3.2 Vehicle Definitions**

3.2.1 The definition of what constitutes a vehicle in one of the classes is at the discretion of the Championship committee and does not of necessity follow any rules laid down by the FIA or the MSA other than in general outline.

##### **3.2.2 Division A - Road Cars:**

Cars in classes A1 to A8 are cars as defined by the requirements of Sections S10 and S11 of the current MSA Yearbook as Road Going Production Cars and Road Going Specialist Production Cars.

Class A7 is open to cars manufactured prior to 1 January 1980, or of a type that was in production prior to that date. Only period modifications are permitted with the exception of tyres (allowances will be made for older cars (e.g. veteran or vintage cars), where the available options are limited due to the size and type of tyre required.)

Class A8 is open to full production models from classic marque clubs including MG, Austin Healey, Triumph, Jaguar, TVR, Morgan, Ginetta, Lotus, Porsche, Renault Alpine, Mazda (RX7 and MX5 variants only), Vauxhall (VX220 variants only), BMW sports cars (i.e. cars with a 'Z' prefix) and Ferrari. Other marques may be included by the Championship committee, following a formal request from the established marque owners club.

##### **3.2.3 Division B - Modified Cars:**

Are cars as defined by the requirements of Sections S10 and S12 of the current MSA Yearbook as Modified Limited Production Cars and Modified Specialist Production Cars, including two seater cars not complying with classes in Division A (Road Cars) as defined in these regulations, provided that modifications and safety regulations for Modified Production Cars are adhered to (see Section S10.1 of the current MSA Yearbook).

Group B Sports Cars, GT1 Sports Cars and World Rally Cars (as defined at S14.1(d) to (f) of the current MSA Yearbook) will run in the Competition Car Division and in the appropriate Sports Libre class.

##### **3.2.4 Division C - Competition Cars:**

This section includes cars from the Sports Libre and Racing Car classes.

Sports Libre Cars shall comply with the definitions and requirements of Section S10 and S14 of the current MSA Yearbook. The Sports Libre classes will include Special Saloons, these being saloon cars and other four seater cars not complying with classes in Division A (Road Cars), Division B (Modified Cars), or Division C (Saloon Libre cars only) as defined in these regulations, provided that safety regulations appropriate to Sports Libre Cars are adhered to (see Section S10.1 of the current MSA Yearbook). Racing Cars are single seater, open wheeled competition cars, complying with Section S10 and S15 of the current MSA Yearbook.

Cars in class C0 (Saloon Libre) are cars as defined by the requirements of Section S10 and S14.2.4 of the current MSA Yearbook as Special Saloons. In addition, cars in this class must:

- Have an engine that is from the same general manufacturer as the original bodyshell (e.g. Ford car, Ford engine);
- Be two-wheel-drive; and
- Run on pump fuel.

### 3.3 Class Definitions:

For the purpose of the Championship scoring, vehicles will be divided into the following divisions and classes:

#### Division A - Road Cars
